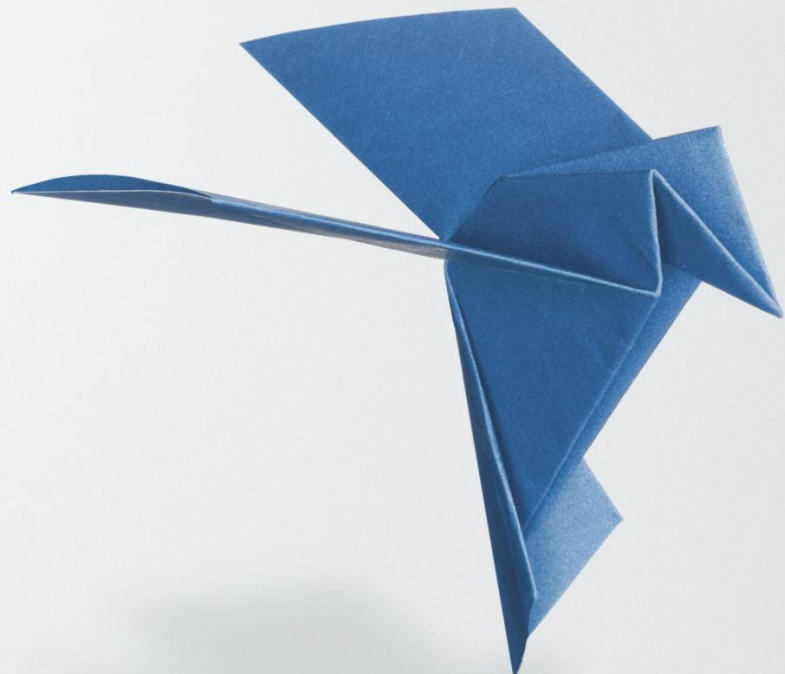

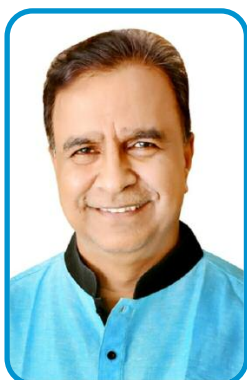
Meri Kumbe

Vice Minister of the Ministry of Culture & Tourism, P.R. China (Video Message)

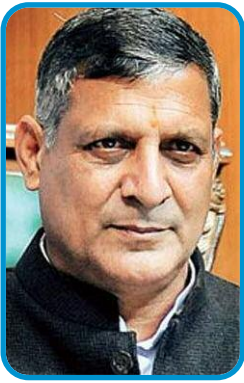

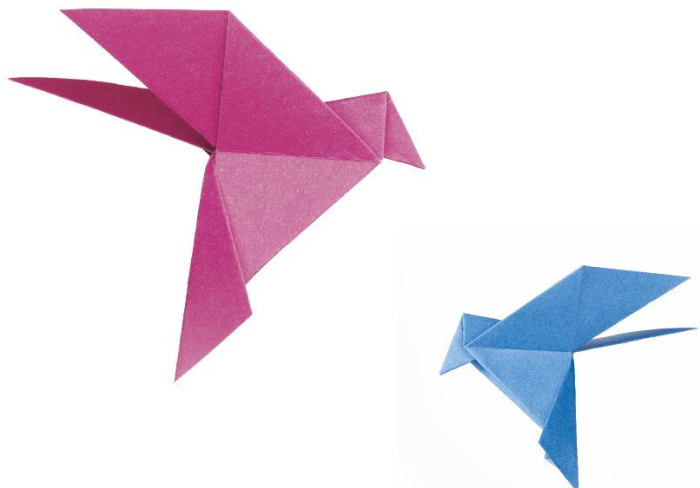

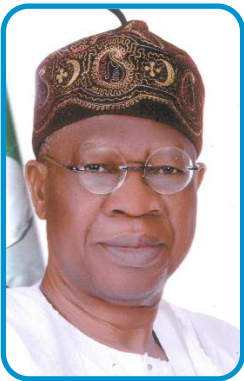

Honourable Minister of Information and Culture

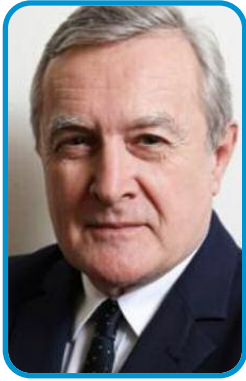

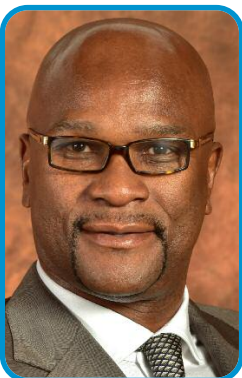
